Phonics Screening

At the end of Year 1, pupils have a Statutory Phonics Screening check. This is where they read 40 words. Some of these are real, some are not real. The children need to use their phonic knowledge to read the words. If children do not take the test, or do not pass the test in Year 1, they are required to take the check in June in Year 2. Parents of children who are required to take the check in Year 2 are contacted to inform them of this.



As a school, we follow the Systematic Synthetic Phonics Scheme from Twinkl. Your child will be bringing home decodable texts linked to the Twinkl scheme where they will practise blending to read words. (More information about Twinkl phonics and the resources we use are on the class pages of the website)



Throughout the year we will be tracking your child's progress in Phonics and we will support them by giving them the necessary resources and teaching they may need to be successful.

Teachers will be teaching daily phonics lessons to prepare for this check. Level 2,3,4 and Phonemes are taught and practice materials can be supplied for home by the class teacher. Pupils are also welcome to practice reading real and non real words at home on www.phonicsplay.co.uk

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Key stage 1 tests - year 2 pupils

It is **no longer statutory** for Year 2 pupils to take tests in English and Mathematics at the end of Year 2. However, the class teacher may use assessment materials to help inform their Teacher assessment judgements. Teacher assessments, like in any year group across school, take place on an ongoing basis throughout the year, to inform the teacher what your child can and cannot do independently as well as informing next step planning for teaching.
