Year 6 Statutory Test Information



The structure of the tests.

At the end of Year 6, during a week in May, your child will sit tests in:

*Reading
*Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG)
*Maths

These tests will be both set and marked externally, and the results will be used to measure your child's progress.

Key Stage 2 Reading

The Reading Test consists of a single test paper with three unrelated reading texts.

Your child will be given 60 minutes in total, which includes reading the texts and answering the questions. A total of 50 marks are available.

The questions are designed to assess the comprehension and understanding of your child's reading.

Key Stage 2 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Test (SPaG)

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts: a grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes, and an aural spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes.

Key Stage 2 Maths

Your child will sit **three** tests:

Paper 1 is for 'Arithmetic' lasting for 30 minutes, covering calculation methods for all operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), including use of fractions, percentages and decimals.

There will be 36 questions in total on the paper; therefore it is important that your child can work at speed, with accuracy and stamina.

Papers 2 and 3 cover 'Problem Solving and Reasoning', each lasting for 40 minutes.

Your child will still require calculation skills but will need to answer questions in context and decide what is required to find a solution.

Key Stage 2 Writing

Writing will be 'Teacher Assessed' by your child's Class Teacher, who will look at a range of your child's writing. There is no set writing test.
